Like the apostle Junia, and many other women leaders in the early church, the Junia Award highlights women's roles in nurturing and sustaining church life. The award seeks to champion groundbreaking new roles for women and roles that are unique in their division. We give preference to women who are pastors, evangelists, theologians, chaplains, religion teachers, administrators and those who function as such.

The purpose of the award is to feature those who can encourage other church leaders who are facing opposition and to assure the worldwide church that women have been accepted as holding up half the sky in a wide array of cultures in the Adventist Church.

100-200 words to detail the **impact** the nominee is having on the church in the division. For example, 'She is the first person to pastor a church in an area...', or 'She has started a novel evangelism method...'

References to news articles or personal stories are helpful but not necessary.

The **name** of the person making the nomination

Your title or relation to the nominee.

Your **email or phone number** in case we have difficulty contacting the nominee.

Information is confidential until verified. Some very deserving nominees do not wish to be named as their job is very sensitive. We will do everything we can to try to protect women who feel unsafe receiving an award.
